




OUR TRAINING

A one-day orientation was given to the facilitators and community painters by the Mvula Trust team consisting of Ilse Wilson+Dzunani Nyathi. The Lowveld Escarpment District Council also gave imput. We watched a video on mural painting and the community painters put on improvised plays about the issues. The next day we had an intense day drawing out our designs! 




PHOSAVILLE

Phosaville is a fast-growing informal village. No visible public walls existed, suitable for painting. So, a special concrete wall was exected for us by the district council. The wall will be extended to become a taxi shelter in future.






Our team consisted of only 5 people—the smallest group of all three villages. They were enthusiastic and eager to tackle the job. Their next project will be the local creché.

Each village came up with their own slogan - Phosaville's slogan was PAY WATER TO LIVE. This mural is the most visible as it is situated on a main road where hundreds of commuters pass each day.

VLAKBULT

Vlakbult is an established village. An obsolete reservoir in the centre of the village was the ideal object for the community painters. Here we had the biggest team consisting of 24 people!

The reservoir is situated across the road from a primary school and every day we had an audience of hundreds of children watching our progress.



THE SPECIATORS




We primed the reservoir first, after which we drew out our designs in chalk, and painted these in black ovelines.




















PHIVA

Phiva is an established village and we found an abandoned and derelict reservoir. The ideal object to paint! 17 people worked on this reservoir. It was a difficult site as it offered no shade. Although the only audience was cows and chickens, the painters remained enthusiastic and inspired.

Mini Murals were painted on boards and erected at the local Masakane office.



Ladders were begged and borrowed from the community.





The vibrant colours and inspiring pictures on the reservoir brightened up the environment.












What the pictures tell us...

What the community painters learnt ...


They learnt:


